

FORMAL LETTER

Dated: 26 May 2022

Honourable Chairperson: Cyril Xaba (Parliamentary Defence Committee)

- 1. As requested to the Chairperson of the parliamentary committee of Defence, South African Parliament I request that urgent overtures get made regarding the following disgraceful conduct of the SANDF towards its non-payment to personnel during Ops Prosper.. July to September 2021.
- a. In July 2021 a national call was made by the CIC for reserves to report to nearest units due to the looting in Gauteng and KwaZulu Natal.
- b. In that period 815 troops arrived in 14 SAI from all provinces going to Umzimvubu Regiment within the base as per orders to be processed and readied for Deployment.
- c. As Adjudant (Captain), I arrived on 27 July 2021 and conditions were shocking, there was no logistics, bear in mind 815 troops in a 4-hectare area in Covid and no heed for the Disaster Management Act rules.
- d. During this time it was a disgrace for the SANDF as we could not kit out the troops, do the Administration, food shortages, and lack of sleeping materials, even tents.
- e. Numerous members got covid including myself.
- f. Generals descended on the base and in August suddenly wanted them all sent home and promised cash payment on the spot before they went home.
- g. Then they promised EFT payments and Col Keeton, Officer Commanding Umzimvubu Regiment, lied to the troops that they would be paid.
- h. It was a logistical nightmare but by end of August 2021 all were sent home by bus, etc.
- i. Till today after 815 files were fully prepared, sent to Army HQ, not a single person has been fully paid.

- j. 5 members have subsequently passed away waiting for their money, no condolences from the SANDF or military funerals or memorials let alone GLIS, Group Life Insurance.
- k. It is I repeat and utter disgrace that 815 members of the SANDF have not been paid even after a board of Investigation was done by General Mazibuko between 28 December and 30 December 2021.
- 1. This was concluded and handed in and General Mazibuko told me his conscience is clear and he handed his report in, legally it can't be discussed, which is correct.
- m. This shameful incident has appeared in numerous newspapers in the last 6 months, including a cartoon, which is disgusting.
- n. The DA asked a question in Parliament and the answer was given by Ms Tandi Modise on 6 April 2022 that the SANDF was busy with the Board of Enquiry. Sir it has been handed in and delivered already by General Mazibuko in February 2022.
- o. As you know Tandi Modise took up her new position as Minister of Defence in August 2021 in the middle of a chaotic South Africa.
- p. The generals involved Generals Moni, Dube, Nthenjane, Thyalishe, Makulu, Mbatha ,Mahapa must stand up and account for their actions.
- q. I will include:

- q5 the SANDF answer in early 2/22 trying to say it was a misinterpretation of call up instructions? The generals visited Mthatha in August 2021 and never said that.

Conclusion

Honourable Chairperson I request that this be seen as a matter of urgency as 815 soldiers of all races left their homes and went back with nothing and the SANDF forgot about them.

I remind you the SANDF is there to protect the Constitution and the people of this country with the armed forces if called by the CIC with a mandate.

As was said in parliament by the shadow minister of Defence, Kobus Marais.. 'we have a broken Army,' and I have sadly to agree but as a Reserve Force Officer of the South African Army I am proud of it and want my 815 men looked after and those 5 departed men to be honoured.

I hope action will be forthcoming Sir.
